**What is it ?**

A gateway to high-quality, evidence-based material relating to different diseases and treatments within this speciality.

**What sort topics are covered ?**

Topics covered *include* the following :

- Conditions/specialist areas
- Conditions grouped by age range
- Diagnosis
- Management
- Prevention and control

**Did you also know that ... ?**

The library includes a 'reference' section. This comprises briefing papers, journal articles, presentations, National Service Frameworks (NSFs), guidelines and much much more!

A specialist resource for measuring the treatments and outcomes relating to **dialysis** :

**Dialysis Outcomes and Practice Patterns Study (DOPPS)**

This is a longitudinal, prospective cohort study which takes place across twelve countries. The participants are a random sample of the population and correlates practice patterns with treatment outcomes.

### How to access Science Direct (Health Sciences Collection)

- Go to <http://www.sciencedirect.com>
- Click 'Athens Log-in', which is at the top right-hand side of the
- Enter your NHS ATHENS username and password
- Use the alphabetical listing to browse for a title, or type in the details of your article or journal name into the 'search' box.
- You can set up a **Table of Contents** alert – keep track of what's hot off the press. Go to the 'Alerts' section to do this.
